### GYRO MEETINGS



Our most recent Zoom meeting was held March 10th with 27 members and one guest participating. Our guest speaker was **Larry Neumeister**, chemical engineer, who took us through a fascinating eight year journey as he designed and oversaw construction of his unique home in Sherwood Park. He began by listing his primary objectives:

- Energy efficient
- Architecturally appealing
- Leading edge technology
- Solar powered and heated
- No fossil fuels

With photos and drawings throughout his presentation, he described how the roof of his garage was fitted with small solar panels that dual functions as shingles in protection and appearance, and the back wall of the garage trapping solar energy differently, using technology involving vacuum tubes containing propylene glycol (to prevent freezing in winter) to heat the entire home, using an under floor heating system. Even his fireplaces were of special design that allowed them to heat the house in case of a failure of the other systems. His other special design features included wall construction that provided R56 insulation value, triple glazed windows (R5), and a myriad of additional features too many to list here. He did a beautiful job of interior and exterior design that made the home extremely functional while pleasing to the eye. His presentation generated was a lengthy question period. Bernie Kropp lives just down the street from Larry, watched the progress of the project from beginning to end and vouched for his story that often bordered on the unbelievable. It was a great evening.

Next Zoom meeting will be on April 14th and the speaker will be Allison McCollum, a partner in the law firm Whiten LLP. She was recommended to us by Rick Craddock. Allison's topic and area of special expertise is "Wills and Estates". She helps her clients create a strategic plan for succession – assessing their current situation, values and goals, and developing a plan to move them forward.
