EDITOR'S RANT Another Perspective on Health Care

After my rant about our broken health care system last month, I felt compelled to explore the other side of the coin.

I don't have a lot of respect or sympathy for the politicians who waste time trying to make political points or prevent others from doing so at the expense of the citizens they represent. Far too many of our elected officials and bureaucrats place their egos and wallets ahead of the public service they were elected or hired to protect.

Most health care workers, on the other hand, are victims of this system just like the people they serve. There are certainly exceptions. Some health care professionals have a bureaucrat mentality and if they ever had the empathy that is essential to provide good care, it has disappeared. However, the system is creating a cadre of professionals who are too overworked, exhausted and unappreciated to continue to provide service with a smile and a caring bedside manner.

Budget cuts that ignore the fact that the health care system is not just working with organs and statistics, but is, most importantly, dealing with human beings is doomed to ultimately create the demise of true health care. Certainly, an eye must be kept on the costs to prevent system bankruptcy, but if the price for that is the loss of the "care" component of Heath Care, then it underlines the futility of the path we are taking to keep the system afloat. Don't get me started on the "Sick Care" system that unfortunately

has been our reality, at least in North America.

Doctors are leaving their current practices, not just here in Alberta, but across the country. They are seeking an environment where the stress level is tolerable. Many head South while others dream of new opportunities in other provinces. Some give up and retire. Suicide rates amone physicians is at an all time high. The need for more doctors is critical, and yet, the bureaucracy even within the profession seems to take the stance that increasing the numbers may cause harm...harm to whom? Many Canadian doctors, educated in other countries such as New Zealand want to come home and practice here but are prevented from doing so. There must be a safe compromise whereby the injection of a cadre of foreign trained doctors is not barred from contributing to the solution of the Canadian doctor shortage. As many as 20% of Canadians do not have a family doctor, leaving them with few alternatives other than clogging Emergency Rooms or Walk-in Clinics where continuity is minimal.

Provincial governments, including our own here in Alberta, have repeatedly shown little respect for the practicing physicians we have, particularly during the pressures of the Covid crisis. It is little wonder so many of our doctors are leaving and those who stay are less and less capable of maintaining the empathy and caring approach that brought them into the profession to begin with. Calli and I are among the lucky few, who, when our long-time GP opted to leave the province, were able to get an excellent new family doctor, despite his official policy of not accepting new patients, thanks to many referral calls and letters ehe received on our behalf.

Nursing has very similar problems. Their hours have been stretched, their numbers per shift have been reduced and they are under pressure to go "strictly by the book" without making room for the gentle, caring approach that is often vital to actual recovery. On top of that, I spoke with several nurses during, my wife, Calli's, time in hospital who shared that the academic standard to simply be admitted to the program are so high that it is becoming more and more likely that the new grads are tops in book smarts but may have bumped those just a few marks lower who had the genuine empathy and caring that is what nursing should be. This plays right into the government and bureaucrat focus on cost saving and efficiency-at-all-cost mentality.

I still maintain that our health care systems in Alberta, in Canada, and the US, which have been ranked in many studies as near or at the bottom of all developed countries, is broken and in desperate need of a major remake if it is to survive. The question remains, "Is it too late to make the necessary major change in course and philosophical approach?" If the answer is "yes", then we are doomed to have the health of both our counties continue down the path to failure. The government and bureaucracy will also be driven into bankruptcy with no benefit to show for it.

The problem is not the men and women providing the vital services. It is the lack of positive, creative and unselfish planners and funders.


It should be a fun vening and one that you won't want to miss, regardless of your political philosophy.

HEALTH AND WELFARE:


It appears we are still a reasonably healthy lot.
