#### **EDITOR'S RANT**

The long awaited report by Alberta's UCP was the hot topic this week. It seems to have attracted attention across the country. I have not read the report in detail but the highlights certainly shine a light on Alberta/Ottawa differences of opinion. There are certainly peaks and pitfalls yet to be explored on both sides of the argument that will be sure to ensue, but the obvious headline that smacks us all is that Alberta has been a contributor to the CPP to the tune of over 50 percent of the fund's annual revenue. It does strikes me as unfair that a province that has 15 percent of the country's population (excluding Quebec which already has its own plan) contributes over half of the wealth of the fund. Certainly, there will be disputes about the actual figure but I suspect the general number is not dramatically off. Albertans certainly do not contribute a mere 15 percent.

Quebec, the one province that has opted out of the CPP happens to be the other province that has contemplated separation on a larger scale. Coincidence? I wonder.

This leaves my thoughts to wander and imagine, as Danielle Smith's do, what we could do with 334 Billion dollars if we started our own APP. My tiny mind doesn't really think in billions but I know it is a lot. We are in for a serious fight, I suspect. The feds hired Former Governor General, David Johnson, to try and sort out another sticky issue. He was forced to give up, partly due to accusations of conflict of


#### AGING GRACELESLY


