#### **EDITOR'S RANT:**

.For those of you who read the first part of this Rant topic in the last Bulletin edition, you may recall that I expressed concern about the apparent lack of control of this technological phenomenon called Artificial Intelligence, or Al. Over the decades, what started as an interesting project concept that had potential to those able to see it, Al has expanded in capability, potential, and impact at an accelerating rate that is astonishing to the vast majority of the human population. What began as an interesting quirk for those in the know, now is influencing all our lives in ways we couldn't have even imagined just a few years ago.

In the previous Rant, I touched on a couple of examples of the negative potential that AI presents. I promised to flip the coin and note some of the positives it can bring us.

All is already expanding capabilities with

All can determine understanding of the complex factors that influence our chances of survival in this quest. Coincidentally, and probably dominantly, All can also spread so much false information that the goal disappears, awash in misinformation, sometimes referred to in the industry as "Hallucination".

I promised a more positive second part to my rant. I am certainly aware of the huge potential for good that AI can provide. Unfortunately, the jury is still out, in my mind, as to which side will ultimately win this battle for our future.

When I read this to my dog, Jak, he didn't recoil in horror. In fact, he didn't seem to care. Perhaps there is a canine lesson for us all. When I figure out what it is, I will revisit this topic.
