EDITOR'S RANT:

Fellow Gyros Larry and Kathy Klaus, our daughter, Dallyce, and I were having brunch at the Headquarters Restaurant on Thanksgiving Monday. They had been away a lot and we had not seen each other for some time so were catching up on family news. The topics ranged wide and mostly brought smiles to our table but some crossed over into more serious territory beyond the aches and pains befitting our age. As we explored the current state of the world and where its' human population appears to be headed, we felt concern, not so much for ourselves but for the next generations – our children and grandchildren who are about to inherit the mess we seem to have created.

A few generations ago, before technological advances took off, our ancestors led much the same lives as their ancestors had. Things changed slowly at first, but the pace has been accelerating with each decade. The rate of that acceleration is rapidly increasing, thanks in large part to advances in things like the internet and all its variables. The rate can be alarming to those of us who recall simpler times. My grandmother was born under a covered wagon enroute to the newly deeded homestead in Southern Manitoba. She was the first white child born in that area. She witnessed, first hand, the hardships of homesteading, living in a "soddy" for four years as they built their house and cleared the land, sleeping under the table when it rained. She worked as a telegraph operator as a teen.

She lived through horse and buggy times, graduated to automobiles, and witnessed via TV man's first landing on the moon. In her 99 years she saw a lot of change.

This is when the discussions turned to the THANKFUL part of Thanksgiving.

The Klaus's generation and mine, along with many of our members', saw one of the 20th century's world wars, the dawn of the nuclear age, the opportunity to enjoy some of the fruits of capitalism and raise our standard of living to unimaginable levels given where we started. True, there were hardships and sad stories, but overall Canadian middle class did pretty well. There were no wars on our soil, the depression was pretty much in recovery due to the distant war Second World War our elders were involved in. Our adolescent years were filled with optimism. We stored a lot of happy memories, and we agreed that we were perhaps the luckiest generation of all.

But technology kept advancing and accelerating. The internet was the biggest change for most of us. To begin with, we were in awe of the newfound ability to communicate. Some of us lagged a bit behind in keeping up with essential proficiency, but most of us accepted it as a positive advance. Things have changed, with words like "algorithms" becoming a reality and gradually influencing more and more of our lives. We are rapidly losing control. We have lost our privacy. We are losing our time to think before reacting. With newcomers such as artificial intelligence (AI) we are losing our ability to trust what is real. We expressed, during our brunch, concern over what awaits our children and grandchildren in this new world, even if we survive the current political situations that rage around the globe. Our young folks are bright, brave, and tech savvy. They hold the torch that gives us some cause for optimism.

As we head through the latter chapters of our own life stories, most of us who have survived this far, can look back and feel we were, in fact, one of the luckiest generations ever. That is worthy of a huge helping of Thanksgiving.

FOUNDERS NIGHT EVENT

On Wednesday, October 16th, 20 Edmonton Gyros and ladies, including their president George Schuller and his wife, Karin Conradi, joined 52 Sherwood Park Gyros and ladies and 1 guest gathered at the Park's Broadmoor Country Club to celebrate Gyro's annual Founders' Night event. It began with an hour of refreshments and visiting followed by a fine buffet dinner capped with delicious roast beef.

After dinner, the traditional history of Gyro started by the three founders, Paul Schwan, Gus Handerson and Ed Kagy. They started Gyro in Cleveland on June 24, 1912, but was not incorporated until October 21, 1914, with rapid growth in the USA and Canada through World War 1 and into the post-war era. It covered much of the USA and arrived in Canada. The Edmonton Club was chartered on July 29, 1921. The Sherwood Park Club was chartered on October 4, 1975. There is now even a Gyro chapter in Japan. The history of how Gyro's objectives evolved over time was reviewed, ending as the Gyro we know today.

Following that part of the program, our guest speaker, Sherwood Park's RCMP Constable **Kristin Appleton** was joined by Constables **Kristan Henry** and **Michael Alfred**.

The topic of their presentation could be summarized as "SCAM ALERT".

For the next 45 minutes they educated us about the variety of scams that are growing at an alarming rate with many of them being primarily directed at seniors and young people. Sophistication has advanced at an ever accelerating rate, particularly with technology such as AI and more sophisticated phishing techniques. After describing what to look out for and recognizing possible scam attempts, the trio then advised us on how to react, including not yielding to the temptation to respond and what to do if you yield anyway. We were given coordinates, including police, government agencies and private services, that we can contact if we suspect or realize we have been targeted by scammers. They are included in the photos that follow. Constable Appleton stayed throughout the rest of the meeting to answer personal questions and hand out material.

Edmonton president George Schuller gave a presentation on behalf of the Edmonton club before the evening wound up.

The consensus was that it was not only a very enjoyable evening but an extremely informative and timely one. Our thanks go out to all the participants and especially the RCMP Constables for generously and enthusiastically giving their time.
